COUNCIL REPORT FOR JUNE AND JULY 2021

Despite the pandemic, council continues to meet monthly and there are always matters that need consideration. The following is a summary of the major items discussed during the past two meetings:

- 1. At the June meeting Pastor Joe presented a proposal to have a scaled down version of VBS since restrictions for gatherings were slowly being lifted. Council gave its blessing that VBS go ahead following the proposal to meet outside and limit the number of children attending. VBS took place the week of July 5 and was truly a blessing to all who participated and we thank God for making it possible.
- 2. The deacons and elders who had completed their terms of service were thanked and the new deacons and elders were welcomed to council.

- 5. Pastor Gregg has been in contact with the EOHU regarding Ontario's phase 3 of the re-opening plan. This means that singing will once again be allowed during worship services and that there will no longer be capacity limits during worship services as long as social distancing can take place. It also means that programs such as junior Sunday School and regular Sunday School can begin again. The executive of council will meet to draw up a re-opening plan and present this to council. This does mean that much planning will need to be done and that many volunteers will be needed again. We pray that all those who volunteered in March of 2020 will consider volunteering again so that there will be Sunday School teachers, nursery helpers, greeters, coffee servers, etc. We pray that all members of the congregation will consider prayerfully how they can serve with the gifts God has given them. We look forward with anticipation to the day when all of the congregation can meet together again to worship and sing praises to our God and all the other programs will be in place again.
