THIS WEEK: HAITI RELIEF

Will you help Haitians left homeless after the earthquake? On August 14th, a 7.2 magnitude earthquake shook Haiti, and has so far claimed nearly 2,000 lives. It left thousands more injured or missing, destroyed property and compounded the suffering of the island nation. An estimated 30,000 people have been left homeless-exposed to the elements during hurricane season. World Renew, as a member of the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, has joined the Humanitarian Coalition in asking Canadians to give generously to help those impacted by the crisis. COUNCIL REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER 2021

Council continues to meet regularly to encourage each other, to discuss how our congregation can be a light in this community and to plan what our worship services and ministries will look like as our province continues to re-open. The following is a summary of the last meeting:

- 1. Elder James Kooistra led in opening devotions reading from Joshua 1 where Joshua is told by the Lord to be strong and courageous for the Lord will be with him. The elders, deacons and pastors are also to be strong and courageous for the Lord will be with them as we begin this new church season.
- 2. Permission was given to the Seaway Valley Singers and the local Scout troop to use our facilities as they have done in the past. They will have to follow all required protocols.
- 3. Approval was given for the Grade 1 and 2 Sunday School class to meet during the second half of the worship service. The Sunday School children must sit socially distanced and this requires larger classrooms. By having more Sunday School classes during the worship service, the larger classrooms can be used both during the service and after it.
- 4. Both pastors reported on their ministries since the last council meeting. Pastor Joe will bring Bibles to three young adults of our congregation who were married this summer.
- 5. Now that more families are attending the worship services again, there was concern that some people were sitting much closer than the required two meters. The elders will once again help to usher in the families and larger families will be asked to sit on the outside rows of pews where every second pew is roped off.
- Classis Eastern Canada will meet virtually on October 16 and delegates from our council will attend. 6.
- 7. Concern was expressed that some people do not socially distance during the coffee time after the worship service. Everyone is reminded of the need to sanitize, to wear masks and to distance, even outside.
- 8. Two couples will be commissioned to visit the elderly members in the congregation. More details will follow. James Kooistra, elder to the elderly, will also continue to visit these members.
