Council report for February 2022

The church council met for its regularly scheduled meeting on February 8. The meetings are scheduled for the second Tuesday of every month. The following is a summary of discussions held and decisions made:

- 1. Council completed the classical credentials. Our church is a member of Classis Eastern Canada and this body meets twice per year to discuss aspects of ministry in our church and also ministries that these churches do together. This spring meeting of classis is on March 4 & 5 and is hosted by Barrhaven Fellowship CRC but will be held via ZOOM. Our delegates to classis will be Pastor Gregg, elder John Menkhorst and deacon Stuart Staal. Before every classis meeting the churches are given opportunity to ask for advice from classis or to ask classis to discuss a certain topic. The main topic at this meeting of classis will be the Human Sexuality Report.
- 2. Council acquiesced with Mike Luchies' request to resign as elder in our congregation for personal reasons. He will continue to do his ministry as elder until a new elder is chosen, probably in May or June. Neil VanderMeer will replace him as the vice-chairman of council.
- 3. The clerk was instructed to distribute a letter to the congregation asking for nominations for deacons to replace Anjo Norg and Stuart Staal and for elders to replace Eric Don, John Menkhorst, Neil VanderMeer and Mike Luchies. The letter will be sent out by email, will be available in the foyer of the church and will be delivered to some members of the congregation. Members of the congregation are asked to prayerfully consider which members of the congregation have the gifts to serve in these capacities.
- 4. The deacons reported on their ministry. They have been in discussion with several families in the community and congregation.
- 5. The Tech Committee reported that they have begun work in the balcony and are eagerly awaiting the arrival of the components they have ordered.
- 6. Please continue to pray for the pastors, elders and deacons, especially as this pandemic, and the resulting restrictions, affect our meeting together.
