COUNCIL REPORT FOR MAY AND JUNE 2022

Council has resumed its in-person meetings and is excited that as elders and deacons we can sit around one table and discuss the matters pertaining to our church. The following is a summary of the discussions of the past two meetings:

1. The congregational meeting held on May 17 included a very informative presentation about the Refugee Resettlement program of World Renew. Because our church is located in a rural area far from supports for refugees, the deacons are looking into working with the refugee committee of Immanuel CRC of Cornwall. More details will be made available later.
2. The two Sunday potlucks have been very successful with many families participating and enjoying a time of fellowship and food. Two more potlucks are scheduled for July 10 and August 14. More details will be found in the bulletin.
3. The newly chosen deacons and elders were welcomed to the June meeting and those who had completed their terms were thanked and given the opportunity to share words of encouragement. The following is a list of the officers of council and the committee reps: chairman—Jack Menkhurst; vice-chairman—Jason Wagensveld; FAC rep—Derrick Noort; Worship Committee rep—Josh Geertsema; Education Committee rep—Chris Johnson; Community Service Committee rep—John Guthrie; Safe Church Committee rep—Andrew DeJong; Tech Committee rep—Mark Geertsema. The deacons will choose a new chairman at their next meeting and this person will also be part of the executive of council.
4. The rental policy for our facility is being revised because of the new tech equipment which will hopefully be installed soon. This policy will be available soon.
5. Both pastors report regularly on their ministry in our congregation and community. Pastor Gregg and Laurie are on vacation at this time and Pastor Joe and his family will be on vacation after VBS and SERVE.
6. A discussion was held about returning to having the offerings as part of the worship service but the decision was made to continue with the current practice of having the offering bags in the foyer for the time being.
