GIVING AS PART OF WORSHIP: All Christians would agree that giving of our financial resources is an act of worship. Since the beginning of the pandemic the means by which we give to our church has changed since it was thought that the passing of the offering bags could possibly spread the covid virus. As a result, church members were encouraged to give via PAR or e-transfers and the offering bags were moved to the fover so that they did not have to be passed through the congregation. At the recent council meeting the council approved the request from the deacons to return to the custom of gathering the offerings during the worship service. Starting on November 6, the offering bags will no longer be in the fover but will be passed around during the worship service and a prayer will be offered for a blessing on these offerings. Of course, you can still continue to give via PAR or e-transfers. If you have any concerns about this, please speak to one of the elders or deacons.

FALL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING: Congregational meetings are an important aspect of keeping a church doing ministry among its members and in the community. At these meetings elders and deacons are chosen, ministers are called, budgets are approved, reports are presented and sometimes guest speakers are brought in. Important decisions are made. At the annual fall congregational meetings the budget for the next year is presented, discussed and approved. However, at these meetings the attendance has been declining consistently and now less than 15% of the confessing members pass a budget on behalf of the rest of the congregation. For this reason, council has decided that this year's fall congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, November 20, after a potluck lunch following the morning worship service. It is the prayer of council that more members will attend the meeting and participate in the discussions and decisions that are made. Please mark this date on your calendar. The agenda and other relevant documents will be distributed shortly.

COUNCIL REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER 2022: Council continues to meet regularly to discuss the ministries, programs and business of the church. Below is a list of the more important items that were dealt with. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to discuss it with one of the elders, deacons or pastors.

- We desire that our church be a safe place for all and especially for children and other vulnerable people. We thank Lindsey DeVries for looking after the police check file for many years and ensuring that all volunteers had an up-to-date vulnerable sector check. James Kooistra has taken over this position and has sent letters to all those whose police check is not current. If you received a letter from him, please complete the necessary form either in person or on line asap.
- 2. Classis Eastern Canada meets on October 21 and 22 at Barhaven CRC. Our delegates are Pastor Gregg, elder John Guthrie and deacon Jason Schell. Classis is an opportunity to hear about the ministries that we do together as a group of churches and to share in the joys and struggles of the other CRC's in eastern Canada. At this classis meeting candidate Brad Bootsma will be examined before he begins his official ministry at Charlottetown CRC.
- 3. Anjo Norg and Sharon Schuler are gathering the necessary data for a new church directory. If your information or that of someone in your family is incorrect, do not hesitate to give them the corrections.
- 4. For a notice about receiving the offerings during the worship service, please look for a notice elsewhere in the bulletin.
- 5. The membership of Heine and Hennie Veerman was received from Community CRC of Dixon's Corners. We pray that our congregation may be a blessing to them as they will be a blessing to us.
- 6. The "Code of Conduct" is a new document that outlines how all pastors and leaders in the church must conduct themselves when ministering to members of congregations. Council discussed how this document will affect our congregation.
- 7. The fall congregational meeting was scheduled for November 20. Please see the notice elsewhere in the bulletin.
- 8. Since attendance at the New Year's Eve worship services has been declining, council has eliminated this service for this year and the themes of this service will be incorporated into the New Year's Day service.
- 9. Council requests that the members of the congregation pray for the pastors, deacons and elders as they meet and discern God's will for our congregation.
