SERMON NOTES

COUNCIL REPORT FOR NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER 2022:

Council continues to meet monthly and below is a summary of the matters dealt with during the last two months.

- 1. We want our church to be a safe place for everyone and especially for the vulnerable members of our congregation and community. For this reason all volunteers must have a current police check. If you have been reminded that your police check is not up-to-date then you are reminded to update it asap. It is a very quick process if you use the online portal.
- 2. The membership of Gayla Postma was transferred to First CRC in Hamilton. Gayla was thanked for sharing her musical gifts with our congregation.
- 3. Council is having a discussion about the size of the current council. The number of elders and deacons has not changed during the past 20 years but the number of active members has decreased.
- 4. The last church photo directory was published about 10 years ago. Council is looking for two volunteers who would organize a picture taking day for members of the congregation. Families of the congregation would have the opportunity to purchase family photographs and a picture directory would be organized of all the households of the congregation.
- 5. The deacons were thanked for hosting the Christmas luncheon for the seniors of the congregation. A note of appreciation was received from one person who was blessed by the meal, the fellowship and the GEMS who served the meal. A special thanks to those who worked in the kitchen to prepare the meal.
- 6. At every council meeting the FAC (Finance and Administration Committee) reports to council. The congregation is thanked for their financial generosity in supporting the work of the church and also reminded that there is still a significant amount required before the end of the year to meet the financial obligations for 2022. Council approved the purchase of new fridge for the kitchen and council was reminded that there are other repairs that need to be looked after.
