COUNCIL REPORT FOR NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER 2022:

- 1. We want our church to be a safe place for everyone and especially for the vulnerable members of our congregation and community. For this reason all volunteers must have a current police check. - 3. Council is having a discussion about the size of the current council. The number of elders and deacons has not changed during the past 20 years but the number of active members has decreased.
- 4. The last church photo directory was published about 10 years ago. Council is looking for two volunteers who would organize a picture taking day for members of the congregation. Families of the congregation would have the opportunity to purchase family photographs and a picture directory would be organized of all the households of the congregation.
